Co-founder of Orchard

Orchard was a three-year project on New York's Lower East Side from 2005-2008, where an ongoing program of exhibitions, events and screenings took place in a storefront gallery. Press included the New York Times, Artforum, Texte zur Kunst, Springerin, Flash Art, Art in America, Modern Painters and other publications. Orchard was subsaequently invited to exhibit and offer presentations in London, Los Angeles, Antwerp. After Orchard closed on schedule, the MIT Press journal Grey Room published an Orchard Dossier, with writings by, John Miller, Melanie Gilligan and others on the impact of the gallery upon the artworld.
